






# The litmus test was Nipah, says Shylaja

'It brought out gaps in health system'

The first Nipah outbreak in 2018 was a litmus test of the resilience of Kerala's public health system, Health Minister K.K. Shylaja has said. The experience in managing the outbreak helped the State realise the weaknesses in its public health system and build a more sensitive and alert disease surveillance mechanism, she said at a webinar organised by the United Nations on Public Service Day, 2020, on Tuesday.

The UN marked the day to honour people who risk their lives to deliver essential public services amid the pandemic. Ms. Shylaja was the speaker from India, along with UN Secretary-General António Guterres and WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreye-

sus, among a chosen few leaders.

Answering a question on how the State had primed itself for the response to CO-VID-19, she said two consecutive Nipah outbreaks and major floods in 2018 and 2019 had taught the State public health system the importance of disease surveillance and preparedness. When COVID-19 broke out in China, Kerala knew that there could not be any delay in taking pre-emptive measures.

OBC panel gets 6-month extension

It needs more time as its work has been affected by the pandemic, says Javadekar

The Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved a sixmonth extension to the commission appointed to examine sub-categorisation of Other Backward Classes.

Headed by retired Delhi High Court Chief Justice G. Rohini, the commission will now have till January 31, 2021, to submit its report, the government said in a statement.

The commission had been appointed in October 2017 with the initial deadline of 12 weeks. It has received several extensions since then.

Union Information and Broadcasting Minister Prakash Javadekar said the Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, had decided to give the extension. He said the work of the commission was ongoing but had been affected by the CO-VID-19 pandemic.

The statement said the commission was looking into the issues of communities that were not getting the benefits of reservation.

#### 'Rectifying anomalies'

Mr. Javadekar said, for instance, certain castes were left out of the ambit because of a difference in the spelling in a State. He said the commission would address such "anomalies". "The commission has come to the view that it would require some more time to submit its report since the repetitions, ambiguities, inconsistencies and errors of spelling or transcription, etc. appearing in the existing Central List of OBCs need to be cleared.

"Hence it had sought extension up to July 31, 2020. However, due to the nationwide lockdown and restrictions on travel imposed on account of the COVID-19 pandemic, the commission was not able to perform the task assigned to it," the statement read.



 Headed by Justice (Retd.) G Rohini, the commission was constituted under Article 340 of the Constitution with the approval of the President on 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2017.

 The Commission consists of five members including a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and three other Members appointed by the President by warrant under his hand and seal.



 The conditions of service and tenure of office of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson and other Members is determined by President.



• 102<sup>nd</sup> Constitution Amendment Act, 2018 provides constitutional status to the National Commission for Backward Classes (NCBC).





• It has the authority to examine complaints and welfare measures regarding socially and educationally backward classes.

• Previously NCBC was a statutory body under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment.

# **Background:**



- Two Backward Class Commissions were appointed in 1950s and 1970s under Kaka Kalelkar and B.P. Mandal respectively.
- In Indra Sawhney case of 1992, Supreme Court had directed the government to create a permanent body to entertain, examine and recommend the inclusion and exclusion of various Backward Classes for the purpose of benefits and protection.





• In pursuant to these directions parliament passed National Commission for Backward Classes Act in 1993 and constituted the NCBC.

 123<sup>rd</sup> Constitution Amendment bill of 2017 was introduced in Parliament to safeguard the interests of backward classes more effectively.



 Parliament has also passed a separate bill to repeal the National Commission for Backward Classes Act, 1993, thus 1993 act became irrelevant after passing the bill.



# Fishing Cat

IN-SPACe: Regulator

• Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre (IN-SPAC) is the new body that the government has formed which will act as a regulator and whose rulings would be bound by both the space agency as well as private firms in the country.



IN-SPACe will hand-hold, promote and guide the private industries in space activities through encouraging policies and a friendly regulatory environment.



# New Space India Limited (NSIL):

• New Space India Limited (NSIL) was incorporated to carry forward the industry production of space systems and the ISRO's efforts in realising Polar Satellite Launch Vehicles (PSLV) from industry.



• It is the commercial arm of ISRO, which will be the interface to engage with startups and private companies for new applications and use the space infrastructure to build them

# It differs from ISRO's existing commercial arm Antrix Corporation:

 Antrix will handle ISRO's commercial deals for satellites and launch vehicles with foreign customers.

• NSIL will deal with capacity building of **local** industry for space manufacturing.









- An ordinance bringing all urban and multi-State cooperative banks under the supervision of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has been approved by the Union Cabinet.
- Urban cooperatives and multi-State cooperative banks have been brought under RBI supervision process, which is applicable to scheduled banks.
- Currently, these banks come under dual regulation of the RBÍ and the Registrar of Co-operative Societies.

 Developed by an independent team and published by UNESCO, the Education For All Global Monitoring Report published from 2002–2015, aimed to sustain commitment towards Education for All.


• It published 12 Reports from 2002 until 2015.



• It was then renamed, and re-launched under a new mandate as the Global Education Monitoring (GEM) Report, UNESCO, whose principal role is to monitor progress towards the education targets in the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda.

• In line with its mandate, the 2020 GEM Report assesses progress towards Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4.

• UNESCO's **Headquarters** are located in **Paris**.

• It has **193 Members and 11 Associate Members** (As of April 2020) and is governed by the General Conference and the Executive Board.





• Three UNESCO member states are not UN members: Cook Islands, Niue, and Palestine.

• While three UN member states (Israel, Liechtenstein, United States) are not UNESCO members.
