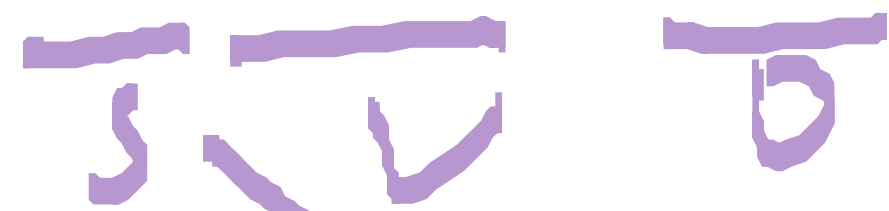

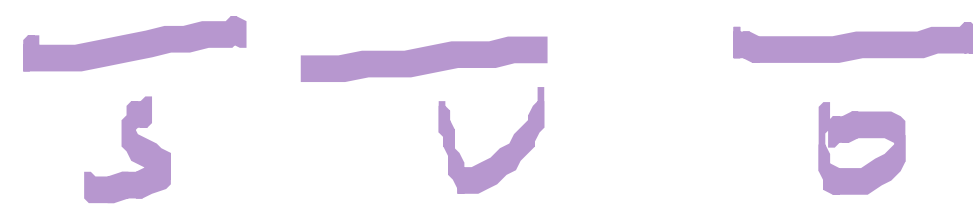

# RULE NO.1

- When two or all the three persons come together as subject / object, the order is..... 2,3,1

• ~~X~~ eg. I, you and he have done a great job.

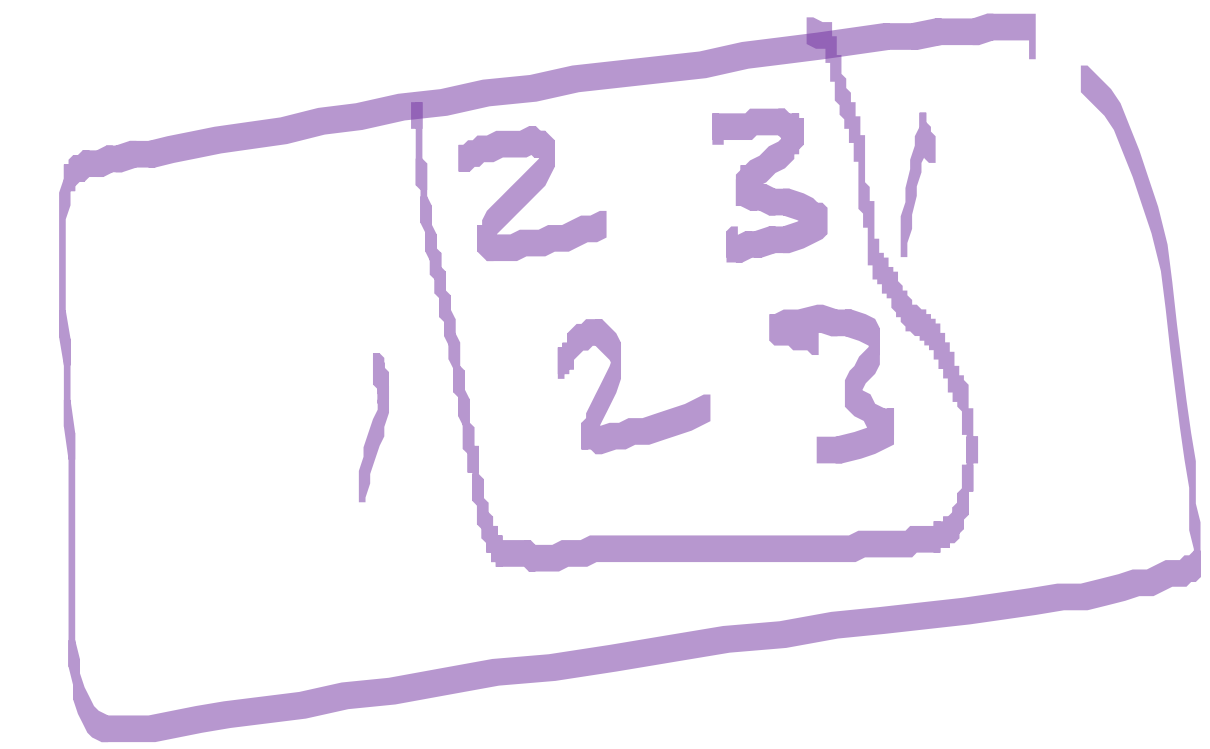
• ~~X~~ I and he are doing it.

**NOTE---** When there is a feeling of confession and plural pronouns, the order is 1,2,3

eg. You and I have killed him.

I and you ✓

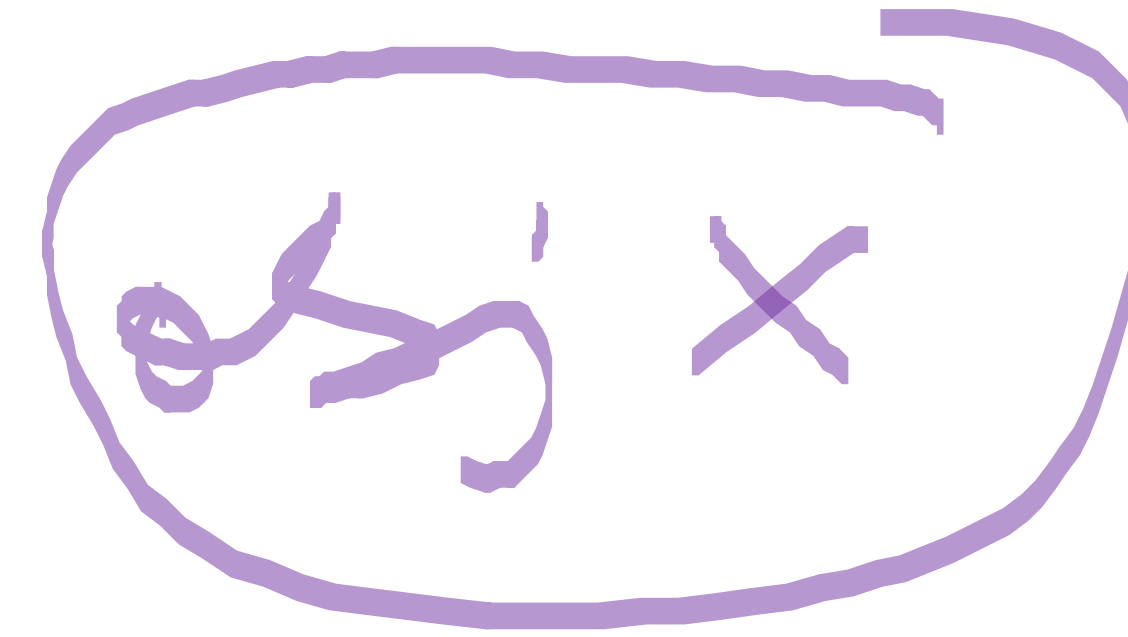

- \* One ..... one/one's/oneself (correct) ✓ ✓ ✓
- he / his/himself (incorrect) ✗ ✗ ✗

  - One has to drink water if he wants to survive. *one ✓*

• He enjoyed in the party. ✗

• She absented me from the class yesterday. ✓

• She absented from the class yesterday. ✓

# RULE NO. 7

- Some verbs don't take reflexive pronoun with them.
- **Keep, stop, turn, qualify, bathe, move, rest, hide etc.**
