Uttar Pradesh Teacher Eligibility Test (UPTET) is a state-level exam, conducted to recruit teachers for primary and upper primary. UPTET is conducted in two parts Paper 1 is for primary school teachers i.e. Classes 1 to 5. Paper 2 is for two who wish to teach Classes 5 to 8. UPTET is a good opportunity for those who have a desire and aptitude to teach. Official notification by Uttar Pradesh Education Department contains details on eligibility, syllabus and other requirements.
